José L. Díaz-Gómez MD, MAS, NCC (UCNS), FASE, FCCM, MBA Institute Chief of the Integrated Hospital Care Institute, Cleveland Clinic Abu Dhabi, UAE

Dr. José L. Díaz-Gómez, MD, MAS, NCC (UCNS), FASE, FCCM, is Institute Chief of the Integrated Hospital Care Institute at Cleveland Clinic Abu Dhabi.

His immediate previous position was chief of cardiothoracic, mechanical circulatory support, and transplant critical care at The Texas Heart Institute at Baylor St. Luke's Medical Center in Houston, TX.

Dr. Díaz-Gómez is a cardiac anesthesiologist and critical care medicine specialist who has dedicated his career to contributing to the clinical practice, research, and education related mainly to the fields of perioperative and critical care ultrasonography. His initial investigations on critical care ultrasonography education highlighted the interdisciplinary application of this tool in critical care practice. He subsequently proposed alternative techniques in advanced critical care ultrasonography for specific patient populations, such as pulmonary hypertension and mechanical circulatory support. Lastly, he has shown increased safety by applying real-time ultrasonography for bedside procedures such as thoracentesis.

Dr. Díaz-Gómez was a former Associate Professor of Anesthesiology at the Mayo Clinic College of Medicine in 2018. And he started the review process for academic rank promotion as Professor of Anesthesiology at Baylor College of Medicine. He received a master's in applied science at the Bloomberg School of Public Health at John Hopkins University in 2023. And he is pursuing an MBA program at the Weatherhead School of Management at Case Western Reserve University.

Dr. Díaz-Gómez's his medical degree from Universidad Pontificia Bolivariana, Medellin, Colombia. He completed his residency and further cardiac anesthesia training at the Cleveland Clinic, Cleveland, OH, and his fellowship at Massachusetts General Hospital, Harvard Medical School, Boston, MA.

Dr. Díaz-Gómez's research contributions include over 75 peer-reviewed publications in critical care medicine and ultrasonography; an edited book in critical care ultrasonography; an edited critical care ultrasound booklet; a dozen non-peer reviewed publications and two dozen book chapters. He is the co-chair of the upcoming SCCM critical care ultrasonography guidelines and he has been re-elected as the Anesthesia designated seat within the SCCM Council. He is a member of the SCCM Biomarkers Leadership Task Force and leads the Cardiac Biomarkers group.

Dr. Díaz-Gómez holds the Fellowship in the American College of Critical Care Medicine (FCCM) and the Fellowship in the American Society of Echocardiography (FASE).

Dr. Díaz-Gómez resides in Abu Dhabi with his wife. In his spare time, he enjoys biking, traveling, and cheering for his children in high-level soccer and tennis tournaments as they are current student athletes in the USA.

Jose L. Pascual, MD, PhD, FRCS(C), FACS, FCCM, is the system section chief of surgical critical care for the Division of Trauma, Emergency Surgery and Surgical Critical Care at the University of Pennsylvania Perelman School of Medicine in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, USA. He is a professor of surgery and neurosurgery and has a cross-appointment in the School of Nursing. He obtained his medical degree from the University of Ottawa in Canada and completed his doctorate and general surgery residency in experimental surgery at McGill University in Montreal, Canada. He completed his fellowship in trauma and surgical critical care at the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania.

Dr. Pascual is an attending surgical intensivist at Penn Presbyterian Hospital, the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania, and the Philadelphia VA. He is co-medical director of the surgical ICU at the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania. He also attends as a neurointensivist in the Penn system. Dr. Pascual currently runs a bench research laboratory specializing in trauma and specifically traumatic brain injury. He is the Penn Simulation Center specialty director for surgical critical care and an associate examiner for the American Board of Surgery. Dr. Pascual serves and has served as chair and vice-chair of multiple national committees of the Eastern Association for the Surgery of Trauma (EAST) and American Association for the Surgery of Trauma (AAST). He has authored more than 150 book chapters, commentaries, and original manuscripts in peer-reviewed journals.

Dr. Pascual has served SCCM in many capacities since joining in 2000. In addition to his nine years on the Council, Dr. Pascual was cochair of SCCM's Congress Program Committee and Strategic Planning Management Committee and chaired the Graduate and Resident Education Committee, Lifetime Achievement Award Subcommittee, and Research Section Steering Committee. He served as secretary and chair of the Research Section and was part of the inaugural section executive committee. In 2015, he was recognized with SCCM's Presidential Citation Award. Dr. Pascual is also an editorial board member for Critical Care Medicine and serves as ad hoc reviewer for several other medical and surgical journals. He is a frequent author, lecturer, and mentor and has received numerous research funding grants and awards throughout his years in academic and clinical practice.

She has secondary appointments in the School of Medicine, Clinical Translational Science Institute, Department of Critical Care Medicine, and Department of Biomedical Informatics. In addition to her academic appointments, Dr. Kane-Gill is a critical care medication safety pharmacist in the Department of Pharmacy at UPMC. Dr. Kane-Gill is a past president of the Society of Critical Care Medicine (2022).

She has been invited to present her work at numerous professional meetings and she has published over 250 articles and book chapters related to critical care and patient safety. Dr. Kane-Gill was recognized in the top 1% of scholars in the world writing about medication errors on World Patient Safety Day 2021. Her research focuses on effective approaches for the detection, prevention, and management of medication errors and adverse drug events with emphasis on drug associated acute kidney injury. She has successfully incorporated health information technology (clinical decision support, telemedicine) into practice to advance healthcare systems, leading to safer and higher-quality patient care. She also applies implementation science strategies to ensure adoption of medication safety practices.
